FORMAT:

- The Ryder Cup is a Two Player Event contested over 18 holes. Each six holes will be a different format- Best Ball, Scramble, Modified Alternate Shot. All flights will play from the WHITE TEES (unless team qualifies to play on GOLD TEES).
- THE EVENT WILL BE PLAYED AS FOLLOWED (11/2/24):
- HOLE 1-6 BEST BALL- Both players on each team play their own ball. One score on each hole is required from each team. USGA rules apply, except as amended by Local Rules.
- HOLE 7-12 SCRAMBLE- Two drives are required from each player. The ball must be played from
 within one club length of the original lie, maintaining the integrity of the shot (ie. drop in the rough,
 if the original ball is in the rough).
- HOLE 13-18 MODIFIED ALTERNATE SHOT- Both players hit tee shots on each hole. The team then selects one ball to play. The other player plays next and the team alternates shots until that same ball is holed out. Each team is required to use 2 tee shots from each player.
- The order of the formats is subject to change by the TD.
- REMINDER: ALL TEAMS MUST REMEMBER TO SWITCH FORMATS AT #7 and #13. Failure to do so, will result in DQ.
- Handicaps are TEAM HANDICAPS. They are computed by using 60% of the lower handicap and 40% of the higher handicap.
- Flights and starting times will be announced Thursday prior to Tournament
- In case of a tie, RRMGC will use the USGA Card Off Methodology: Last nine holes, last six, last three and finally the 18th hole
